


Do cows want to be outside? A progress report

Indoors vs. Pasture




Indoors vs. Sand Pack





Indoors vs. Bark Mulch Pack



During the summer months, cows spend the majority of the night outdoors when provided access to pasture. When provided access to a sand or bark mulch pack, cows spend close to half of the night outdoors.
